## Annual Budget & Board Election Meeting Minutes

- The annual meeting held on 01/22/16. The meeting commenced at 7:30PM.
- Laura Saunders reviewed the status of the LPCC financial accounts. Operating account has \$91,299.31. Lake and Dam Account has \$39,514.97. Debit Card Account for emergencies contains \$3,540.31. Total amount in all accounts is \$134,354.59.
- Mark Finley reviewed the final membership totals for 2015. The budget was based on a total of 358 members. Mark discussed the clubhouse rental income for 2015. The clubhouse earned \$30,415. Rentals have been strong for the first month of 2016.
- The proposed 2016 budget was disseminated to all members present at the meeting. The floor was opened for anyone to discuss line items in the budget.
- Pete Adams questioned the necessity of the amount listed for Geese Management. Laura Saunders confirmed that the amount was correct and the new contract will be unchanged. The general membership at the meeting agreed that Geese Management should continue.
- Pete discussed if the amount listed for attorney fees is sufficient. Mark Finley confirmed that less than \$1500 was spent on attorney fees in 2015 which accounted for the budgeted amount for 2016.
- Laura and Mark discussed the capital projects scheduled for 2016. New picnic tables will be purchased for the swimming beaches, playground equipment will be repaired as necessary, and benches around the clubhouse will be repaired or replaced as needed. The clubhouse will be in need of upgrades. Due to wear and tear, new tables and chairs will be purchased. The clubhouse will likely be scheduled for painting in 2017. In the meantime, paint will be purchased to touch up the facility. The sidewalk in front of the clubhouse is in need of repair. The sidewalk and current downspout configuration currently causes water to pool up and freeze during cold weather. This is creating a liability for the club. A quote has been received to repair the sidewalk and re-direct the water.
- Mark Finley and Laura Saunders discussed events to be held in 2016. The Board explained the decision to not have the Adult Summer Party in 2016 so that additional money could be spent on Lake Pine Days Weekend. Lake Pine Days will include a community wide picnic as it did last year. Members did ask questions about whether or not the Adult Party could still occur for a fee or if other budget items were less than anticipated.
- Laura moved to vote on the budget upon answering all questions. The budget was subsequently approved by unanimous vote.
- Laura presented the Board Members that were up for re-election. Laura was presented for a one year term as President. Mark Finley was presented for a one year term as Vice President. Mary Dagney was presented for a two year term as a Trustee, and Mike Dougherty was presented for a two year term as a Trustee. Laura Saunders moved to vote regarding those presented for re-election. All Board members presented for re-election were voted back into their positions by unanimous vote.
- Laura provided an update on the pedestrian light at the corner of Locust and Taunton. Construction has commenced on the light. The Board is hopeful it will be done before the summer.
- Laura also provided information about the brick wall on LPCC property near Falls Road. The county is requesting that part of the wall be removed as part of a guard rail study.
- Laura and Mark discussed the need for volunteers in the community. All of the events are primarily run by volunteers and will not occur without the community volunteers. A sign up list for volunteers was at the meeting.
- Laura explained that there is a need for Board of Trustees including a Secretary and Treasurer. Laura described the duties of these positions. The floor was then opened to questions.
- Tom McMullen brought up a concern that boats being brought from other lakes could be contaminating the lake and increasing LPCC costs to treat various weeds in the lake. He was going to look into some research on the topic and it will then be discussed further with the Board.
- Mark discussed the concern of vandalism on Lake Pine Property. This included broken benches, tables thrown in the lake, cars driving on the South Beach, and other vandalism around the clubhouse. The community was advised to contact the PD or Tom McMullen, Beach Manager, if any suspicious activity is observed. Tom McMullen advised the members to obtain license plate information if possible. Mark Finley advised members that if they see something, say something.
- A discussion was held regarding installation of a post blocking South Beach from vehicle traffic. It was ultimately determined that information would need to be obtained from the township and fire department as to whether or not this would be a safety hazard.

- Carlie Cattanea discussed an incident at the clubhouse in which she observed teenagers attempting to dislodge the BBQ grills as well as standing on the benches. She contacted the PD as a result.
- Laura discussed Evelyn Moore and her resigning from the Board after ten years. Laura commended Evelyn for her dedication to the community. She is a true advocate for the community.
- The meeting adjourned at 8:30PM.
